Each pup will receive the appropriate vetting to ensure they have a healthy start to their new life. This includes: spay and neuter, vaccinations, microchip implantation and treatment for worms and fleas. These fun, furry, four legged companions will be available for adoption near the beginning of November! ## **ALL ABOUT MICROCHIPS**

### IMPLANTION PROCESS

Microchips are about the size of a large grain of rice. They are injected via a hollow needle under the skin between the pet's shoulder blades. The area is sterilized and then the microchip is placed. The procedure does not require sedation and takes roughly three minutes.

### HIGHER RETURN TO OWNER RATES

According to the American Animal Hospital Association Microchipped pets are significantly more likely to be reunited with their owners. Statistics show that microchipped dogs have a reunion rate of 52.2%, while microchipped cats have a reunion rate of 38.5%. In contrast, non-microchipped pets have reunion rates of only 21.9% for dogs and 1.8% for cats. This highlights the critical role of microchipping in ensuring pets are easily identifiable and can be returned to their owners if lost.

### QUICKER REUNION

Animals who arrive to shelters and veterinary clinics as strays are immediately scanned for microchips, if pets are microchipped and information is up to date staff is able to contact owners immediately. This expedites the reunion process exponentially.

### PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION

Microchips provide the security and peace of mind of lifelong identification. Unlike collars or tags microchips cannot be removed.

## Managers Message

The need for shelter services is significantly surpassing the available resources. CASA has been overwhelmed with surrender requests for both dogs and cats. While cats can navigate the shelter process relatively quickly. Dogs are not fairing as well. Currently the average length of stay for our dogs is 35 days. Meaning they enter the shelter system and then find their forever home in that time. A majority of dogs entering the shelter or looking for placement are large breed and very active. Surrender reasons are most commonly inadequate housing, inadequate time or a behavior of the animal. The number of weekly dog surrender requests has flooded our shelter inbox. We currently have 10 dogs on our waitlist and our average wait for an open kennel is 4-6 months. Previously CASA would accept surrender requests from off island and on island but due to the influx of surrender requests we are no longer reviewing requests made by individuals outside the Stanwood Camano area and are only able to take in animals from our immediate community. In the meantime staff and volunteers have been finding creative ways to keep our dogs happy and healthy. Enrichment toys, music, playtime in the yard and lots of love and walks.

## Dog Yard Enhancements

CASA has a longstanding reputation for maximizing the potential of our compact facility. Over the years, we have implemented numerous upgrades, such as the addition of our Catio, new dog suites, and our latest interior remodel. These enhancements have been made possible by the generosity of our grantors and donors! Thanks to the Stillaguamish Tribes, we are thrilled to announce that our most recent project is now complete: the enrichment yard for our shelter dogs. We have installed artificial turf in the yard, incorporate a climbing structure, set up speakers to play nature sounds or music for the dogs, and create raised flower beds to stimulate their senses. Creating a safe, stimulating, multidimensional area for our dogs to hang out greatly impacts their quality of life during their stay at CASA!
