Animals in Need

The new CASA Mission Statement, "Bringing together animals in need and caring people, forever enriching their lives", was composed with care. Rather than describe the mechanics of "what" and "how" CASA functions, we wanted to say "why" we function as we do.

While the dogs, cats and other animals wait to be adopted or returned to their current homes, CASA provides a temporary home. The emphasis on "bringing together" in the mission statement focuses on the primary goal of the uniting of animals and people. When deciding on how to describe the animals, we vacillated between "needy animals" which implies a small subset of the animals and "animals in need", which refers to all of the animals who come through our doors. All of the animals need food, water, housing and most of all love. Each animal comes to the shelter not knowing what to expect and is in need of loving care. In some cases, they have additional medical and/or emotional needs.

Tillie and Rufus arrived with dry, scaly skin where mange had resulted in hair loss and skin

infections. As part of their treatment, they are now given a high quality diet to boost the immune system, while also being treated for mange itself. Even after they have been scraped clear for mange, they will have to be on a specific monthly flea treatment that also covers demodex mange. They

need to continue with a high quality diet to maintain overall system health for the rest of their lives. This is a commitment for the new family.

FOREVER HOME

Anthony, a lively 2 year old Dachshund mix, had a very rough life at the hands of a cruel person and is extremely fearful of strangers. He is staying in the Cat ISO/office area of the shelter so that he can interact with people. Although he is afraid of all strangers, he is particularly fearful of men/children and hides under the cat cages when they come into the room. With the people he has come to know and who maintain his trust, he is very affectionate, greets them with a wagging tail, bounces, and even some squeals of delight when they arrive in the morning. The joy is short-lived if there is a sudden noise or if his old fears surface. There has been a lot of progress, but he has a very long way to go. Anthony is still an "animal in need."

No matter the circumstance, the goal is always to find "caring people." These are the people who are willing to make a commitment to their pets. The commitment might be providing special food or medicine, but always includes the promise to provide love and care for their pets. At CASA we want to bring together the "animals in need and caring people" to "forever enrich their lives." Often we think in terms of the animal's life being enriched once adopted, but more often than not, the adopter's life is also enriched. Just reading the Happy Tails that appear in each newsletter confirms that the pets bring joy and happiness to their new family. Often people stop by the shelter to say how their pet has helped them through difficult times, being there when they were most needed. Ideally, the commitment is for "forever."

The new mission statement is easy to remember; just think of each of the phrases, and remember why CASA exists.

A Day in the Life of a CASA Cat

It's morning, I hear the jingling of keys and the door knob turning, then this annoying beeping starts, but not for long because once the human comes in she presses some buttons and the beeping stops. Oh Boy I am so excited. I jump down from my nice cozy bed up on the counter. YES!! She sees me and comes over and gives me a pet. Purrrrrrr! I love that she greets me first..... What is she doing now?

She goes into the back and comes out with a bucket, shovel, and another bucket of cleaning cloths. She starts getting busy and scoops my litter and cleans the kennels in the front lobby. She grabs a broom and sweeps up all the dirt and hair from all of us felines. After she sweeps, she then mops the floor. I don't like it when she mops because when I jump down my paws get wet, but it does dry fairly quickly. The front office smells so much better after the cleaning is done.

The front door then gets unlocked and people start coming in. Pick me Pick me! That's what I am saying to them 11 AM but all they hear is Meow. I don't understand why they don't understand me. I wish they would pick me. I may not like other felines, but I sure do love humans... but the right human that knows me and loves me for my sassy attitude.

My Neighbors Walking around the front lobby, I see a funny looking cat in one of the cat condos, It hops around and has two really tall ears. Wait, that is not a cat, it's a bunny.

It's kitten season now. When those cute yet obnoxious little creatures come in the staff takes them to the back (ISO/office) to get vaccinated, dewormed, Felv/FIV testing and flea treated. Sometimes if they are too young they go into foster until they are old enough to be vaccinated and spayed or neutered. When they are finally ready for adoption they get put in one of the kitty condos and sometimes they jump around so much they spill their food. Silly kids don't know how to keep their bedroom clean. I feel bad for the staff that has to clean up after them. So glad I'm such a clean girl.

There was this cat named Lucy who had FIV, and was contagious from feline to feline. She had to stay in a kennel, I can't imagine having to stay in a kennel the whole time she was at the shelter. At least I get to roam free. The weather is beautiful and I love to go outside in the catio, but there are some kitties in the cat room which is how to get to the catio. For a while the cat room was reserved for the kitties that came to the shelter from a home that had too many kitties. They were in pretty bad shape but are fine now. The staff keeps the door to the cat room closed so people can find them.

3 PM Oh my!!! I hear the wonderful sound of the can opening. I hope she gives me first dibs on that soft delicious treat. I will nag her until she does. Some of the other cats have to be on special food for urinary crystals, kidney, liver issues even thyroid. There are so many different types of food. I'm glad I get the good stuff and a variety. Those poor kitties only get one type of food their whole lives.

Well, the humans are packing up and getting ready to leave for the evening. I really miss them when they are gone. Oh goodie, I get once last pet before she goes. Purrrrrrr! I'm so thankful I have them to take such good care of me and the others. I can't wait for morning to see them again and hope that someone comes to adopt me tomorrow. My name is Princess and this is my life at the Camano Animal Shelter.
